About Troop 122

Troop 122 is a boy-led troop. The boys decide the actions of the troop with direction from the Scoutmaster and the Assistant Scoutmasters. Boys must be involved with the events because they themselves make them happen. More responsibility is associated with each advancement in Scouting which provides many opportunities for leadership. And of course we welcome Scouts to ask any of our adult leaders for assistance whenever they need help.

When You Join Troop 122

If you join as a sixth grader or a Webelos fresh out of Cub Scouts, you will be a part of a "New Scout Patrol" (NSP) for around six months. The goal of the NSP is to let you experience and get a feel for the troop and to help you achieve the rank of First Class. A First Class Scout has all the rights and privileges of older scouts, such as holding troop office. After your term in the NSP is completed, you will join one of the primary patrols. If you are already a Scout and join at a later age you may choose a patrol upon entrance into the troop.
